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European Day of Languages



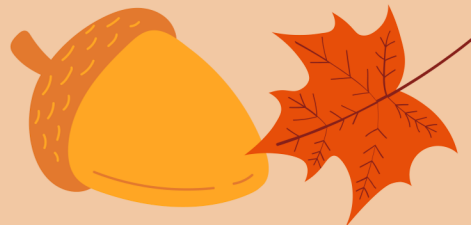
At the Council of Europe's initiative, the European Day of Languages has been celebrated every year since 2001 on 26 September.

The European Day of Languages' aims to:

Raise awareness of the importance of language learning.
Promote the rich linguistic and cultural diversity of Europe.
Encourage lifelong language learning in and out of school.

There are between 6000 and 7000 languages in the world - spoken by 7 billion people divided into 189 independent states.

There are about 225 indigenous languages in Europe - roughly 3% of the world's total.



European Day of Languages Competition

On September 26 at 8:00, two groups of students – one from the 7th grade (Grzegorz, Maciej, Adam, Andrzej) and one group of students from 8th grade (Maria, Wiktor, Mikołaj, Andrew) went to High School number 158 in Warsaw (CLVIII Liceum Ogólnokształcące z Oddziałami Dwujęzycznymi im. Księżnej Izabeli Czartoryskiej), where they took part in a language tournament.

Groups from primary schools played a field game on the territory of the high school. First of all, the game started with rolling the dice on the board game, then students had to find a number on the field. After finding this number they had to scan the QR code. Students were given different tasks connected with culture and history of European countries and languages. One group had to even write a limerick.

Finally, the group of students from 7th grade from our school won the language competition.

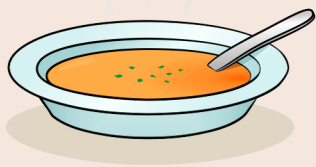



Maybe I will dress up as a mythical creature.**

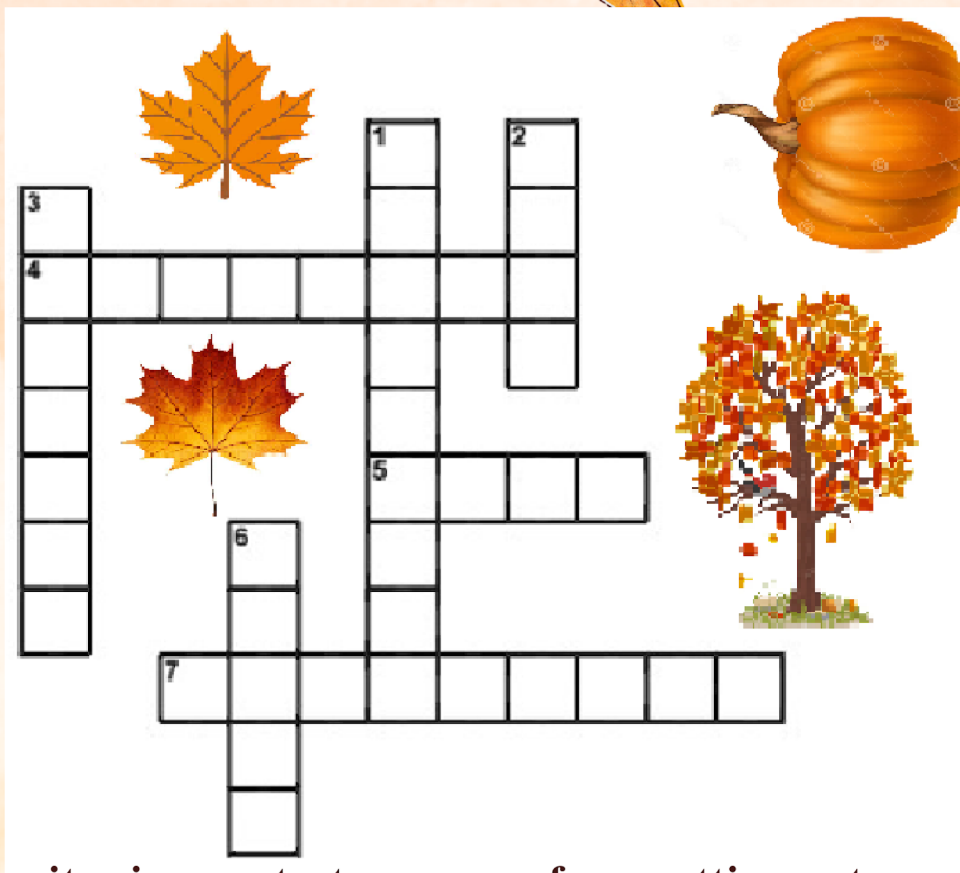
